

Airline pilots fly passengers and cargo to destinations around the world. You'll need to:

- Be over 21 years of age
- Hold a Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL) issued by the <u>Civil Aviation</u> <u>Authority</u> (CAA)
- Pass the <u>Civil Aviation Authority medical</u> before you can take a course the medical includes tests on your fitness, hearing and vision
- Pass <u>enhanced background checks</u>

You can train as a pilot with the RAF but you must commit to 12 years minimum service. Many airlines offer structured training programmes.
