



 - Personal Statement

Technical Details

TAKE YOUR PLACE

- Application cost: £20 or £26
- * 4000 characters or 47 lines of text.
 - Includes spaces and blank lines.
 - You must write a minimum of 1000 characters
- The UCAS website will time out after 35minutes.
- Remember you only get to submit one personal statement
- If you apply through clearing universities will have access to your personal statement.








Personal Statement Content



- What makes you unique?
- What are your ambitions after your degree?
- Enthusiasm and understanding for your subject(s)
- Why right here right now?
- What extra-curricular activities make you better suited for this course?
 - Do they link to your subject?
- Are you taking a gap year?
 - how this will enhance your application and suitability for the course.







Tips and Mistakes to Avoid





There is no 'one size fits all' rule

No two personal statements are the same

Showcase what makes you stand out from the next student

Efficient use of words

Avoid stock phrases and clichés

Avoid rambling

Don't talk about specific universities

Find the balance between modesty and arrogance
